India-Switzerland Bilateral Relations

India and Switzerland have had cordial and friendly relations since India's Independence, based on shared values of democracy and rule of law. India's policy of non-alignment and Switzerland's traditional policy of neutrality led to a close understanding between the two countries.

Diplomatic relations with Switzerland were established with the signing of the Treaty of Friendship at New Delhi on 14 August, 1948; one of the first such treaties to be signed by independent India.

Bilateral ties achieved new heights following the visits to Switzerland of Rashtrapati ji in September 2019, PM Shri Narendra Modi in 2016 & 2018 and that of the Swiss President Mrs. Doris Leuthard to India in 2017. **The Joint Statement issued during the visit of the Swiss President in 2017 described the India-Switzerland ties as 'a long standing dynamic partnership'.**

Apart from its Embassy in New Delhi, Switzerland presently has Consulate Generals in Bengaluru and Mumbai; and Honorary Consuls in Kolkata and Chennai. There is a Swiss Business Hub in Mumbai, and a Swissnex office in Bengaluru. India has an Embassy in Berne and a Consulate General in Geneva.

□ Swiss President Mr. Guy Parmelin paid a two-day visit to India to participate in the AI Impact Summit, 2026 from 19–20 February 2026 in New

Delhi. During the visit, he had a bilateral meeting with Hon'ble Prime Minister Modi. Prime Minister welcomed the initiative of Switzerland to host the next AI Summit.

□ PM Shri Narendra Modi had a brief interaction with the Swiss President Guy Parmelin upon his arrival at Geneva airport on 16 June 2026, en route to Evian, France for his participation in G7 Summit.

□ PM Shri Narendra Modi paid an official visit (stopover visit) to Geneva In 2016. **This was a historic visit; the first bilateral visit by an Indian PM to Switzerland since 1997.** PM's engagements included meeting with Swiss President Mr. Johann N. Schneider-Ammann; a Business Round Table with Switzerland's top companies; and a meeting with Indian research scholars based at CERN.

□ The year 2018 was designated "India's year" at Davos with PM Shri Narendra Modi delivering a key-note address at the WEF opening session. On bilateral front, PM met Swiss President Mr. Alain Berset and discussed cooperation in the areas, such as India-EFTA TEPA, Tax information, renewable energy, BIT, Ayurveda etc.

□ PM Shri Narendra Modi held a bilateral meeting with Swiss President Mr. Alain Berset on 1 December 2023, on the sidelines of COP-28 in Dubai. The two leaders discussed ways to further deepen their partnership , including cooperation in trade and investment, technology, health, education, IT, tourism and people-to-people ties

□ Hon'ble CIM, Shri Piyush Goyal visited Switzerland on 12-13 June 2026 and held bilateral meeting with the Swiss President and Head of the Federal Department of Economic Affairs, Mr. Guy Parmelin in Berne. He also interacted with the representatives of the Swiss pharmaceutical industry and other Swiss industry leaders and investors in Zurich to discuss opportunities for expanding bilateral trade and investment.

□ The largest-ever Indian delegation in World Economic Forum (WEF) annual meeting in Davos from 19-23 January, 2026 was led by Minister of Railways, Information & Broadcasting and Electronics and Information Technology Sh. Ashwini Vaishnaw and included Minister of Consumer Affairs, Food & Public Distribution and New & Renewable Energy, Sh. Pralhad Venkatesh Joshi; and Minister of Civil Aviation, Sh. Kinjarapu Ram Mohan Naidu. In addition, Chief Ministers from Andhra Pradesh, Telengana, Maharashtra, Assam, Madhya Pradesh, and Jharkhand; Deputy Chief Ministers from Gujarat and Karnataka; and Ministers from Kerala and Uttar Pradesh also participated.

□ Principal Scientific Advisor to the Government of India, Prof. Ajay Sood visited Switzerland from 13-16 October 2025 to participate in the Geneva Science and Diplomacy Anticipator (GESDA) Summit in Geneva. During his visit, PSA held meetings with Federal Councillor for Foreign Affairs, Mr. Ignazio Cassis, State Secretary for Foreign Affairs of Switzerland, Mr. Alexandre Fasel, State Secretary for Foreign Affairs and State Secretary for Education, Research and Innovation (SERI), Ms. Martina Hirayama. He engaged with Swiss industry leaders at Swissmem Industry Day, (where he was the guest of honour) highlighting the huge opportunities in India and encouraged investment in India. He also met his counterparts Swiss Federal Councillor for Economic Affairs Mr. Guy Parmelin during the visit. He co-chaired an India-Swiss Business round-table along with Federal Councillor Parmelin.

□ The official Indian delegation for World Economic Forum (WEF) annual meeting in Davos from 20-24 January, 2025 was led by Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw (Minister of Railways, MeitY and Information & Broadcasting) and included Union Ministers of Civil Aviation, Food Processing Industries, Jal Shakti and MoS for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship. In addition, Chief Ministers from Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Maharashtra, and Ministers from Kerala and Tamil Nadu also participated. This was the largest-ever Indian delegation to WEF.

3. Bilateral Institutional Mechanisms

- **Foreign Office Consultations (FOC):** Secretary-level FOC dialogue was established in 1996 with its first round taking place in 2000. The 12th round of FOC was held in Berne on December 2023. **The latest round co-chaired by Sh. Tanmaya Lal, Secretary (West), MEA and Swiss State Secretary for Foreign Affairs was held on 13 February 2025 in New Delhi.**

- **Joint Economic Commission:** Set up in 1959 to strengthen economic and commercial ties, its **latest round was held in Geneva on 24 November 2023 with Additional Secretary, Ministry of Commerce and Industry leading the Indian side.**
- **Joint Committee on Science & Technology:** First meeting of the Joint Committee on S&T was held in 2011 in Berne. The latest [7th] Meeting was held on 01 September, 2025 in Berne. Secretary, Department of Science and Technology (DST) from India, and Ms. Martina Hirayama, Swiss State Secretary for Education, Research & Innovation (SERI), jointly chaired the meeting.
- **Consular Dialogue:** First round of the composite dialogue on Consular and Legal matters was held in New Delhi in 2012. Sixth round was held in New Delhi in February 2023. **The last round took place in Berne in September 2023** co-chaired by Additional Secretary (OIA-I), MEA and Director International Affairs, State Secretariat for Migration(SEM), Federal Department of Justice & Police(FDJP).
- **Financial Dialogue:** First round was held in Berne on 6 July 2012. The latest 6th round of Financial Dialogue was convened in March 2024, co-chaired by Secretary, DEA and Swiss State Secretary for International Finance. The dialogue facilitated exchange of experiences by both countries for collaboration on various aspects including investment promotion, FinTech, sustainable finance and cross border financial services.
- **Joint Working Group on Rail Corporation:** First JWG Meeting under the MoU was held in 2019 at New Delhi. Second meeting was held in Berne in August 2022.
- **Joint Working Group on Climate Change and Environment:** First meeting was held through video conferencing in September 2021. 5. Economic & Commercial Relations

□ Commercial contacts between India and Switzerland date back to the early 19th century when in 1851 the Volkart Trading Co. established its offices in Basel and Mumbai. During the First World War, Switzerland set up its consulates in key locations around the world, including in Mumbai, to secure food and economic prospects.

□ The Integral Coach Factory (ICF) in Chennai set up, based on 1949 agreement signed between the GoI and the Swiss Cars and Elevators Manufacturing Ltd. Zurich, expanded its India network, diversifying its activities, and soon becoming the backbone of Switzerland's economic presence in India.

Bilateral trade

□ Switzerland has remained an important trading partner of India, though the trade balance has been in its favour. With a total trade of USD 23.27 billion, Switzerland was India's 15th largest trading partner in FY 2024-25. While our exports have remained consistent in the past five years, our imports have fluctuated since a substantial part of it is in gold bullion. Switzerland is amongst world's major gold refining centres.

□ The major items of Indian exports to Switzerland are organic chemicals; precious stones and jewelry, metals; textiles; electrical machinery and equipment; pharmaceuticals, agricultural products; machinery and precision instruments, leather products, shoes and shoe uppers, cotton, plastics, etc.

□ Besides bullion, other major items of Swiss exports to India consist of chemicals & pharmaceuticals, machinery, transport equipment's, precision engineering products and watches, etc.

6. Swiss investments in India

□ FDIs from Switzerland to India from April 2000-June 2025 amounted to USD 10.87 billion placing it at 12th position globally. Swiss FDI in India increased by 53% during 2015-2023 recording an average annual growth rate of 9%.

□ 330 Swiss companies are present in India with a subsidiary, joint venture or liaison or representation office, out of which 294 entered Indian market post liberalization of Indian economy in 1991. These companies have created over 1,66,000 jobs in India. 108 companies have their manufacturing facility in Switzerland. 74 out of 108 use India as export hub for other markets. 30 Swiss companies operate their R&D centre in India.

□ Banking and Financial Services, Insurance, Machine, Electrical Engineering and Metals (MEM) & Precision, Construction, Information & Communications, Technology and Software and Services are the leading sectors.

□ The five states of Maharashtra, Karnataka, Haryana, Delhi and Tamil Nadu account for approx 90% of Swiss investments in India. Mumbai-Pune corridor (45%) and Delhi-NCR (23%) together account for over 2/3rd of Swiss companies in India.

□ Top 10 Swiss employers in India include UBS, ABB, Nestle India, TE Connectivity, Rieter India, UBS Business Solutions, Schindler India, Adecco India, Temenos India and STM Microelectronics.

□ MMTC-PAMP, a joint venture between the Government of India undertaking MMTC and Swiss group PAMP, is the first domestic innovator to develop gold bars and colorization of gold coins.

7. Indian investments in Switzerland

□ Overseas Direct Investment from India to Switzerland during April 2000 to

August 2025 was USD 8.9 billion placing it at 10th position.

□ In 2025-26, Overseas Direct Investment (ODI) by Indian companies in Switzerland amounted to USD 1277.49 million. Dr. Reddy's laboratories Ltd. was the biggest investor with an investment of USD 620 million followed by Glenmark Pharmaceuticals Ltd. (USD 385 million); Sanmar Group International Ltd. (USD 100 million); Lupin Ltd. (USD 35.83 million); Deccan Advanced Sciences Pvt. Ltd. (USD 33.639 million) and Famy Pharma Pvt. Ltd. (USD 21.54 million).

□ Major Indian IT companies including TCS, Infosys, HCL, Tech Mahindra, etc. have their offices in Switzerland and provide services to major Swiss pharma companies, banks and insurance firms. Indian companies in pharma and life sciences sectors in Switzerland include Dr. Reddy, Wockhardt and Glenmark. Tata and Birla also have their representative offices.

8. India-EFTA Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement [TEPA]

□ Negotiations on bilateral free trade agreement started in October 2008. After 21st round of negotiations held over 16 years, the agreement was finally signed on 10 March, 2024. With this, Switzerland and the other EFTA States became the first European partners to conclude a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with India.

□ A dedicated EFTA Desk has been established to facilitate flow of investments from EFTA countries into India. Swiss State Secretary of Economic affairs, Ms. Helene Budliger Artieda visited India for the inauguration of EFTA Desk in New Delhi on 10-11 February 2025.

□ Post signing the TEPA, Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Sh. Piyush Goyal visited Switzerland twice: on 09-10 June, 2025 and again on 12-13 June 2026, underscoring India's steadfast commitment to deepening strategic and economic partnerships with EFTA countries including Switzerland.

□ The landmark Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement (TEPA) between India and the EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) entered into force on 1 October 2025, representing a significant milestone in the trade and economic relations between the parties. The occasion was marked by a high-level event, the Prosperity Summit, in New Delhi hosted by Shri Piyush Goyal, Minister of Commerce & Industry of India. EFTA was represented by Helene Budliger Artieda, Swiss State Secretary at the State Secretariat for Economic Affairs.

□ India and Switzerland signed a **Bilateral Investment Treaty** in 1997, which came into force in 2000 with an initial duration of ten years. Later, Pursuant to the Cabinet approval on the Model Indian BIT in 2015, it was decided to terminate the existing BITs with countries whose initial duration period is over and re-negotiate based on the revised Model BIT. Negotiations are being held to negotiate a new BIT.

□ **DTAA** was signed on 21 April 1995 to avoid double taxation on the same income.

9. Science & Technology Cooperation

□ The Inter-governmental agreement for S&T cooperation was signed in 2003 during the state visit of Swiss President to India. Within the framework of this agreement, the Indo-Swiss Joint Research Program (ISJRP) was initiated with Swiss Government in 2005 in-order to further advance the bilateral S&T co-operation.

□ A Joint Committee, co-chaired by Secretaries from both sides has been established as per bilateral agreement. The Joint Committee is responsible for review of all the bilateral activities under the Indo-Swiss S&T Cooperation programme. The last meeting was held in Berne in September 2025.

□ During the State visit of President Shri Ram Nath Kovind to Switzerland in 2019, a Letter of Intent for further strengthening S&T cooperation under India-Switzerland Science and Innovation Alliance was signed. The Mission celebrated 2019 as the India Year of Science and Technology in Switzerland.

□ India has been represented at the GESDA (Geneva Science and Diplomacy Anticipation Summit) generally held in the month of October every year in Geneva. The 3rd summit held in October 2023, was represented by Joint Secretary level official and whereas 4th Summit was virtually represented by Secretary level official from MEA, where Indian side shared India's experience and initiatives for inclusive development, utilizing science and technology particularly through open access digital and mobile platforms. For the 5th GESDA Summit, Principal Scientific Advisor to Government of India, Shri Ajay Kumar Sood participated.

□ During the visit of Dr. Martina Hirayama, Swiss State Secretary for education, research and Innovation at ISRO Satellite integration and testing establishment on 25 March, 2024, it was discussed that a space delegation from Switzerland would visit India with a goal of intensifying bilateral cooperation. The Swiss delegation comprising start-up founders, incubators, innovation centres, representatives of education institutions, and space and space-tech researchers attended Indo-Swiss Space Week 2024 in Bengaluru during 23-26 June 2024 and participated in India Space Congress-2024 on 27 June 2024.

□ During the AI Impact Summit hosted by India in New Delhi, the Swiss President Parmelin announced that Switzerland will host a future edition of the AI summit. The event is planned to take place in Geneva in the first half of 2027 and will be organised jointly by the Federal Department of the Environment, Transport, Energy and Communications (DETEC) and the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA).

□ A new collaborative mechanism with Switzerland in the fields of Innovation and R&D- **“India-Swiss Innovation Platform”** was launched in Bengaluru on 30 October 2023. The platform launch coincided with the first Indo-Swiss Anti-microbial Resistance (AMR) dialogue, in which about 50 experts from the two countries participated to discuss innovative approaches to address the serious but silent public health threat posed by AMR to the humanity.

□ The 2nd round of India-Swiss AMR Innovation Dialogue took place from 27 April-2 May 2025, with a rich programme across Switzerland, with visits to the Universities of Zurich, Geneva, Berne and Basel, Global Antibiotic Research and development Partnership (GARDP). Roche and the workshop at the Swiss Re Center for Global Dialogue in Ruschlikon. This provided a platform to foster collaboration between experts of India and Switzerland to discuss about the solutions for one of the world’s most important challenges of the 21st century-AMR. About 92 experts from both the countries, including 25 from Indian side participated in the dialogue. The organizing team from the Indian side included researchers from National Centre for Biological Sciences(NCBS). Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER) Pune, together with Swissnex-India.

10. Cooperation in Railways

□ An MoU was signed between our Railways Ministry and with its Swiss counterpart for technical cooperation in Rail sector on 31 August 2017 with cooperation in areas including Traction Rolling stock, EMU and Train sets, Traction Propulsion Equipments, Tilting Trains, Railway Electrification Equipment, Train scheduling and operation improvement and Tunneling technology, etc.

□ The first JWG Meeting under the MoU was held in 2019 at New Delhi. The meeting was launched by Chairman Railway Board from Indian side and Federal Councillor and Head of the Swiss Federal Department of Environment, Transport, Energy & Communications from the Swiss Side. The 2nd meeting of JWG on technical cooperation in rail sector was held at Berne on 30 August 2022.

□ A renewed MoU was signed by Shri Ashwini Vaishnaw, Minister of Railways, Information & Broadcasting and Electronics & Information Technology and his Swiss counterpart Mr. Albert Rosti, Federal Councilor and Head of the Federal DETEC, on 29 October 2024 at a virtual ceremony. The MoU aims to enhance technical cooperation between the two countries for improving railway operational efficiency, safety standards, and service quality and infrastructure development.

□ Swiss rail companies/entities involved in operations in India are Stadler Rail Management AG, Furrer& Frey, Huber+Suhner, ABB Ltd, SWISSRAIL and SWISSMEM.

11. Air Connectivity & Tourism

□ An Air Services Agreement (ASA) was signed in May 2001. The two sides presently have open sky policy. Swiss Airlines commenced direct flight to Delhi from December 2007. The Protocol amending India-Switzerland Air Services Agreement was signed in March 2020. Swiss Air operates direct daily flights to Delhi and Mumbai under code sharing arrangement with Air India. After a gap of 27 years, Air India started operating direct flights (with frequency of four flights per week) from Zurich to Delhi beginning 16 June 2024.

Indian Tourists in Switzerland:

□ Switzerland has a very good reputation in India and remains one of the top destinations for Indian travelers, whether for a honeymoon, to explore the locations of it's famous Bollywood films or for mountain and city adventures. Switzerland is a prime destination for Indian tourists. With 666'641 generated overnights in 2024, India is the 10th highest source market for Switzerland in terms of tourist arrivals. Indian tourists to Switzerland increased from 1,25,561 in 2023 to 1,54,822 in 2024. The number of Swiss tourists in India increased from 41,004 in 2023 to 44,122 in 2024. (Source: Bureau of Immigration, GoI).

12. Education/Skill Development

□ In 2016, an MoU was signed between our Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) and the Swiss State Secretariat for Education, Research and Innovation (SERI), on Cooperation in the fields on Skill Development as well as Vocational and Professional Education and Training. The purpose of the MoU was to support India's massive skill requirements as well as to strengthen Swiss vocational and professional education and training in international context.

13. Ayurveda & Health Cooperation

□ Complementary Medicine is a part of the Swiss Federal Constitution. Ayurveda along with three other traditional systems of medicine i.e. Chinese, European and homeopathy, has been approved for federally recognized national diploma examination in Switzerland.

□ During the 8th Geneva Health Forum, a session on 'Indian Traditional Medicine Systems interacting with Modern Medicine System' was held in 2020, in which Ayurveda and Unani streams of medicine were discussed. Keynote speeches during the inaugural Plenary were made by Minister of Health and Family Welfare and Minister of State for AYUSH.

□ A virtual meeting on India-Switzerland Bilateral Health Cooperation took place in 2021 with the participation of Swiss Federal Office of Public Health, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (India) and Ministry of AYUSH (India).

□ **International Ayurveda Symposium (12-13 October 2024, Luzern):** The first-ever Symposium held in Switzerland was supported by our Ministry of Ayush, and attended by Secretary, Vaidya Rajesh Kotecha and Director, AIIA, Prof. Dr Tanuja Nesari. 200-strong participants included eminent Ayurveda practitioners, researchers, proponents and enthusiasts from across the globe.

□ A 3-Day 'India Fest & Margazhi Utsav – 2024' was organized at Zurich from 6–8 December. Inaugurated by Ambassador, the 3-day festival featured a Panel discussion, classical and folk performances, a 'Bharat Fashion Walk', and a rare Yakshagana presentation highlighting India's rich cultural heritage. The event also featured Indian cuisine, exhibitions, an ODOP lounge and a vibrant Indian Bazaar among many others.

□ Commemorating the 9th Ayurveda Day 2024, Embassy of India, Berne organized an Ayurveda and Wellness exhibition on 29 October 2024 with the theme "Ayurveda innovation for Global Health". On 23 September 2025, Mission set up an Ayurveda and Wellness lounge to mark the 10th Ayurveda Day, celebrated under the theme "Ayurveda for People and Planet."

□ From 20-24 January 2025, Mission adopted 'Five Days – Five Themes at WEF Davos 2025' and interacted with guests at its Trade & Investment, Incredible India, Yoga and Ayurveda, Indian Tea, ODOP and GI tagged products and Make In India (MII) lounges.

14. Climate Change and Environment

- During the state visit of President Shri Ram Nath Kovind to Switzerland in 2019, an MoU on Technical Cooperation in the field of Climate Change and Environment was signed. This was renewed during latest (4th) meeting of Ind0-Swiss JWG on Climate Change and Environment held on 22 September, 2025 in New Delhi.

15. Cultural relations & people to people contacts

□ Switzerland has always been a meeting point for East and West and the connection between Himalayas and Alps are stronger and deeper. Swami Vivekananda visited Switzerland in 1896. Switzerland also hosted another great sage of India, Maharishi Mahesh Yogi, who is the founder of Transcendental Meditation. This land also welcomed Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore in 1926 and Mahatma Gandhi in 1931.

□ A 'Festival of India' in 12 cities of Switzerland and Liechtenstein was organized in 2018 under the theme 'Connecting Himalayas with Alps' which was well received.

□ The celebrations of 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi provided great opportunities to promote Gandhian values.

□ 'India in the Alps' - an Indian cultural festival showcasing music, dance, exhibition, cuisine, crafts, Bollywood & yoga in Switzerland was organized in 2022 at Berne, Zurich & Geneva as a part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav celebrations. The events were well received by diaspora as well as Swiss populace.

□ To celebrate the 75th anniversary of India's independence and also of India-Switzerland diplomatic relations, photo exhibitions of great Indian personalities like Mahatma Gandhi, Rabindranath Tagore, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and Swami Vivekananda were organized in various cantons across Switzerland during 2022-2023.

□ Swiss Games Museum in Montreux has a unique collection of games which originated in India. While the Lugano museum has some of the rare collections of photographs of Mahatma Gandhi, the Swiss National Museum in Prangins has an exhibition of unique collection of cotton fabric from India. The Charlie Chaplin Museum at Vevey also has an India connect.

□ Museum Rietberg in Zurich has one of the best collections of Indian Miniature paintings. An exhibition dedicated to "Ragamala", a jewel of Indian miniature paintings where music, poetry and painting fuse together, is being organized by Museum Rietberg from 20 September 2024 to 19 January 2025, presenting around fifty masterpieces.

□ An exhibition, 'Being Jain: Art & Culture of an Indian Religion' was organized at Museum Rietberg from 18 November 2022 to 30 April 2023 showcasing Jainism in India, featuring 20 objects loaned from various Museums in India.

□ **Courses on Indian Studies at Swiss universities:** The Universities of Lausanne (UNIL) offer courses on Indian Studies which covers language and literature (Hindi & Sanskrit), culture and history.

□ The University of Zurich (UZH) offer courses on Indian Studies/ Indology. In addition to the introduction to Indology, the course offerings include a diverse range of modules in the core areas of language acquisition (Hindi, Sanskrit & Pali), culture and society.

□ **Statues/busts of Indian icons:**

- A Mahatma Gandhi Statue was installed at Ariana Park, Geneva in 2007.
- A bust of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore was unveiled at University of Lausanne in October 2011 by President Smt. Pratibha Devi Singh Patil during her visit to Switzerland.
- A bronze bust of Swami Vivekananda was installed at Saas Fee in August 2013 on the occasion of 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. Saas Fee was visited by Swami Vivekananda in August 1896.
- In a major public event, President Shri Ram Nath Kovind unveiled a bronze bust of Mahatma Gandhi in September, 2019 along the banks of Lake Geneva at a picturesque location in Villeneuve where Mahatma Gandhi visited in 1931 to meet Romain Rolland.

□ **Yoga:**

- Yoga is very popular in Switzerland. Many private yoga studios/resorts/retreats offer yoga classes/ sessions in almost all cantons of the country. About a quarter of a million Swiss residents are yoga practitioners and women make up the bulk of the yoga-practicing population.
- Embassy of India was the part of “The Guardian Ring” programmes envisaged for International Day of Yoga 2022 celebrations.
- In its efforts to further the reach of Yoga in Switzerland, our Mission in Berne has been organizing Yoga sessions at various cities in Switzerland, including celebrations of International Day every year, including in the year 2026.

□ Bollywood filmmaker Yash Chopra who shot many movies in Interlaken region in Switzerland, was honored by the city of Interlaken with a bronze statue in a central location in Interlaken.

□ Bollywood icon Shahrukh Khan was honored with lifetime achievement award at the 77th Locarno Film festival in August 2024.

□ In February -March 2025 & 2026, the Indian Film Festival, organized by the Embassy of India, showcased a diverse selection of acclaimed Indian films across various genres in multiple Swiss cities, earning widespread praise. Mission also participated in the first and second Asia Pacific Film Festival, held in Berne in Jan-Feb, 2025 & 2026.

16. Indian community

□ There are over 29,248 Indians, including about 9662 persons of Indian origin (mostly in Engineering, IT, pharmaceuticals and paramedical, nursing fields) staying in Switzerland. Some are deployed in the International Organizations like UN, UPU and other prestigious Swiss institutes, like Federal Institute of Technology, Zurich and EPFL, Lausanne.

□ The Indian community is concentrated in Zurich, Geneva, Basel, Baden, Berne and Lausanne. 2,419 Indian students are studying in Switzerland. A number of Indian associations actively organize cultural activities and celebrate Indian Festivals and national days.

□ Pravasi Bhartiya Samman Awardees in Switzerland are:

- **Late Dr. Rajendra Joshi**, Swiss-based NRI scientist was one of the most prominent members of Indian Diaspora who passed in 2019.
- **Dr. Shachi Gurumayum**, an NRI based in Switzerland had been conferred the Award in 2021 for his contribution in the field of Bio-tech Agronomy.
- **Dr. Archana Sharma**, a particle physicist at CERN is among the prominent personalities of diaspora who is conferred the Award 2023 in S&T field.
